

Dear friends, what a great moment for our community as we celebrated the 90th anniversary of foundation for the parish and school of St Therese. I like to thank all who participated and helped make our celebrations so meaningful. We are the Church, called to be on earth the heart of God, a timeless vision that continues to send us forth even after 90 years!

The Gospel for this weekend (Mark 12:28-34) sums up what we should be on about as we look ahead from this milestone. Jesus is asked which commandment is first, and He draws His answer from our First Reading (Deut 6:4-5) as well as Leviticus (19:18). He quotes the *Shema Yisrael* (Listen, O Israel), the Jewish prayer that expresses communal faith in God in stressing the need to love God with one's whole self and one's neighbour.

Catholic writer Rose Marie Berger in *The Revolution: A Field Manual for Changing Your World* explains: 'Jesus summarised all the teachings as 'Love God and love your neighbour'. Our neighbour isn't just found in our family, workplace, or apartment. It's the kid flashing gang signs, the smelly homeless man who lives in the park, the transgender prostitute who works the downtown corner, the crazy old woman who lives alone outside of town, and the immigrant family that doesn't speak English. Jesus gives us the strength of God's love so that we can learn to be allies with those whom society has pushed to the margins'.

At the time of writing, we have 6 children starting their preparation for First Reconciliation and we welcome them this weekend. As we enter into November, we specially remember those who have died and reflect on how their lives and sacrifices influence and inspire us in our call to love God and neighbour, which ultimately draws us nearer to God's kingdom.

There was only one Mass last weekend and a good crowd (English and Polish speaking parishioners) gathered at the start to wish each other a happy 90th anniversary! There were the regulars, but also in attendance were those who had a connection with the parish and school from yester-years, those who grew up here and came back specially. There was a blast from the past, with a fresh rendition of *Nearer my God to Thee* and *Hail Holy Queen* sung 90 years ago at the laying of the foundation stone. Also memorable was a

'video interview' with parishioners (Betty Wilson, Barbara MacArthur and John Adamus) and MSCs (Stephen Hackett and Mark Hanns) reflecting on their time at the parish. A BBQ lunch followed with many taking a walk down memory lane at the history display.

POLISH NEWS Nowa Kaplica św. Jana Pawła II

Na Jasnej Górze została poświęcona nowa kaplica św. Jana Pawła II. Jest tam relikwiarz z krwią papieża i jego "Totus Tuus", pastorał i obraz z wizerunkiem Ojca Świętego.

Kaplica św. Jana Pawła II na Jasnej Górze, jak mówią paulini, ma być miejscem żywej modlitwy pielgrzymów, którzy za przyczyną Maryi, wzorem Ojca Świętego, chcą docierać do Boga, aby odkrywać Jego uzdrawiające oblicze. Niech ta nowa przestrzeń modlitwy, kaplica św. Jana Pawła II, będzie przestrzenią wolności. Miejscem, gdzie odnajdziemy na nowo pełną wolność dzieci Bozych. Prosimy, aby to miejsce było odnajdywaniem duchowej drogi Jana Pawła II, zawierzenia Bożej Matce, Maryi".

O. Arnold Chrapkowski zauważył, że dokonująca się zmiana pokoleniowa powoduje to, że Jan Paweł II staje się powoli papieżem z odległej przeszłości. "To dlatego dzisiaj na Jasnej Górze poświęcamy kaplicę jemu dedykowaną. Papieskie słowa zawierzenia Totus Tuus tak mocno tu wybrzmiewają. Te słowa były nie tylko programem całego jego życia, ale był to jego sposób na życie". Przypomniał również, że pielgrzymowanie Jana Pawła II na Jasną Górę naznaczone było "wielkimi treściami, które zawsze dotykały rozmaitego zniewolenia: politycznego, moralnego, duchowego, jak i spraw wolności, którą w pełni odzyskujemy tylko w Jezusie Chrystusie". Św. Jan Paweł II mówił: "Tu, pod Życzę wszystkim błogosławionego tygodnia. okiem Maryi, naszej Przewodniczki po drogach wolności, odzyskujemy wzrok duszy, odzyskujemy utraconą wewnętrzną wolność, powracamy z ciemności niewiary, naszych ludzkich skrępowań, do wewnętrznego uzdrowienia, przechodzimy z niewoli do wolności".

Kaplica św. Jana Pawła II znajduje się pomiędzy Wieczernikiem a Kaplicą sakramentu pokuty. Ta lokalizacja, zdaniem przeora Jasnej Góry, o. Samuela

Pacholskiego, dobrze wkomponowuje się w to, co św. Jan Paweł II, mówił o tym miejscu, że Jasna Góra to konfesjonał i ołtarz Narodu. Zadaniem każdego sanktuarium, jest tworzenie warunków do nawrócenia i przemiany zycia. Pragniemy, by to dziedzictwo Jana Pawła II, jego nauczanie, nigdy nie zostało zapomniane bądź pomniejszone". Wyraził ufność, że materialne znaki pozostawione na Jasnej Górze, a związane z osobą Jana Pawła II, przyczynią się do utrwalania tej pamięci i nauczania papieskiego. Kaplica św. Jana Pawła II ma przede wszystkim charakter sakralny. Jej centrum stanowi więc ołtarz i ambona. Pośrodku umieszczony został relikwiarz z krwią papieża i jego zawołanie "Totus Tuus" – "Cały twój, Maryjo". Obok jest replika krzyża – pastorału, znaku papieskiej posługi. Głównym elementem wystroju nowej kaplicy jest obraz z wizerunkiem Jana Pawła II. Na ścianie umieszczone są stacje drogi krzyżowej, rzeźby wzorowane na Golgocie z jasnogórskich wałów.

"Od dawna szukaliśmy możliwości stworzenia przestrzeni dedykowanej specjalnie Janowi Pawłowi II, wiedząc kim on był i jest dla nas. Mam nadzieję, że to wszystko, co udało się w tą trudną przestrzeń wprowadzić, godne jest tego miejsca i Ojca Świętego Jana Pawła II". Przypomnijmy, że najcenniejsze pamiątki po Papieżu: przestrzelony pas sutanny, złoty różaniec i złote serce z napisem Totus Tuus, umieszczone są obok Cudownego Obrazu Matki Bożej.
