EPIPHANY - A LIGHT FOR ALL NATIONS

Is 60:1-6; Eph 3:2-3,5-6; Mt 2:1-12

Epiphany means manifestation. We can so easily be drawn to thinking of the Christmas celebration as a private affair of our own family or the community or even a secular celebration that is about anything but Christ. In fact, this feast of Epiphany draws us to see that Christmas is something much broader. The manifestation is that Christ stands at the crossroads of history. For all people travelling these roads, Epiphany is a call and a challenge. It brings down the barriers separating nations and shows that Jesus is for everyone.

Matthew is the only evangelist to give an account of the Magi and it is very colourful. Over the centuries, Christian imagination has made them kings or astrologers or wise men. In fact we do not even know how many there were. There are three because they bring three gifts. The arrival of these unexpected visitors in Jerusalem caused quite a stir. They went straight to King Herod and asked if they could see the newborn child. Herod knew he did not have a newborn heir to his throne so he sent the scribes to find out where the Messiah was to be born. The scribes came back with the text from the prophet Micah. The Messiah was to come from Bethlehem in Judea. It was a poor town. Herod asks only one thing: When you have found the child, come back and tell me and then I can go and worship Him too.

The Magi set off and saw the star they had been following from the east. It settled over a house and they went in to find the child with his mother and Joseph. The account finishes in a beautiful way. Having learned of Herod's wicked intentions, they 'left for their own country by another road' (v.12). They must have been transformed after they had seen the child Jesus. In the Bible, a change of one's path symbolises conversion. For us, this must also be the outcome of our encounter with the Lord. It must give us a new capacity to take another road.

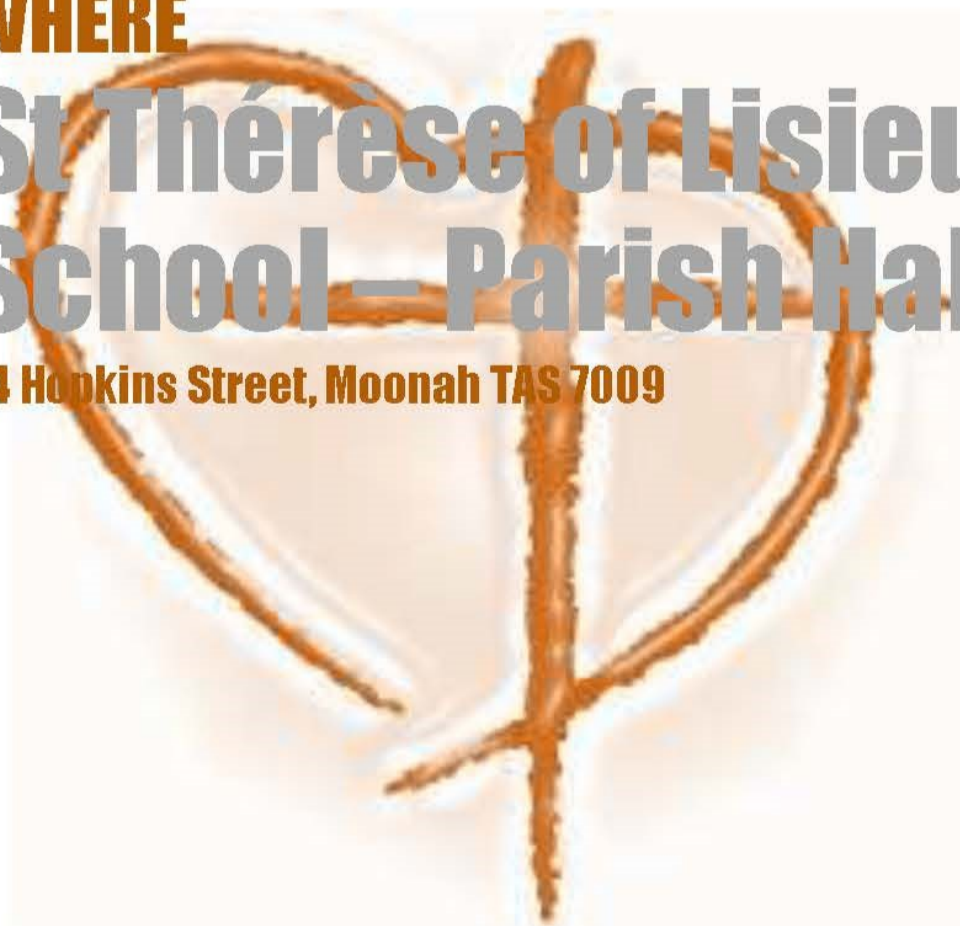
