ST. THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX



Dear friends, this weekend we celebrate the feast of St Therese of Lisieux (1 Oct), patron saint of our parish community. This little flower of Jesus has much to teach us in her ‘little way’ of growing in holiness as one of child-like dependence and trust in a God of love. She discovered her vocation as love, a love that comprised all she had wanted to be, a love that is all embracing of time and place, a love that she wanted to make known to as many as possible. She was a young girl who fearlessly changed the thinking of her time – to go from trying to appease the justice of God to atoning for

the rejected love of God. Her way may seem simple, but it is this very simplicity that makes it possible for us all to follow. It is not necessary to do heroic deeds, but simply to live a life of love. In other words, bring love to every situation!

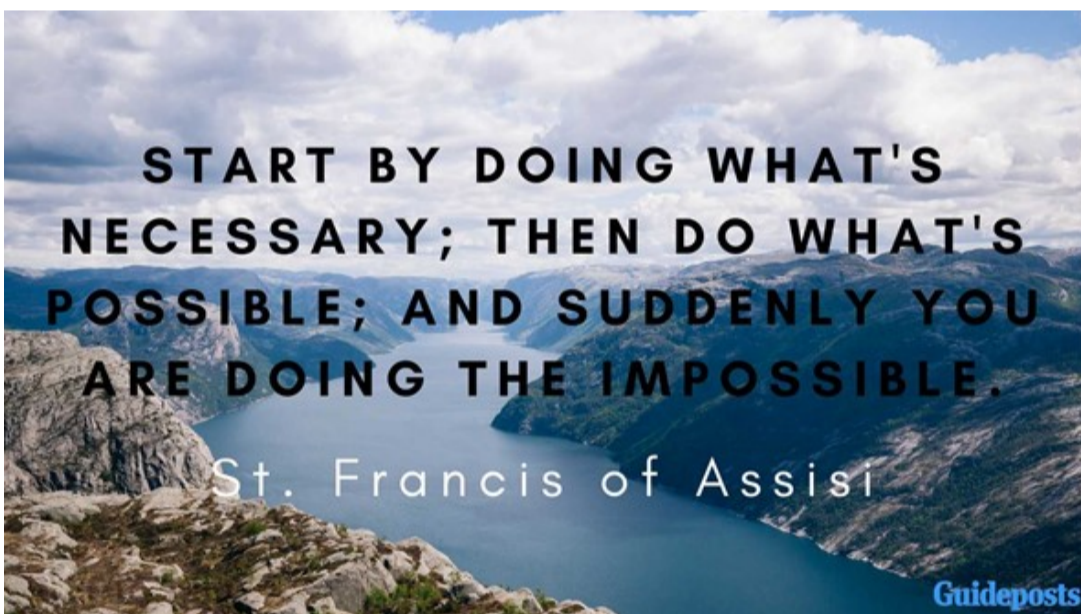


In this spirit, we also approach the end of the Season of Creation, which closes with the feast of St Francis of Assisi (4 Oct), the patron saint of ecology, and one who had a deep love for creation and for the poor. We have been blessed with heartfelt sharing and reflections from our community during this past month. Br. Peter set the scene for planet Earth as our one and only home, and how humanity arrived very late on the scene in the unfolding of creation. Fran shared what the school has been doing to live

more sustainably in caring for our common home and inspired us to do likewise. Monica and Sr. Margaret reflected on the invitation of Pope Francis to an ecological conversion of the heart in order to see creation with new eyes as gift and family, to feel kinship with as

'brother and sister' as St. Francis did when he wrote the Canticle of the Creatures. Br. Sean reflected on today's pervasive throwaway culture and how our response is all about taking the next best step. I hope this has been far from merely intellectual or abstract learning, but one that invites us to experience "*through the grandeur and beauty of the creatures, we may by analogy contemplate their Author*" (Wisdom 13:5).

Our Readings this weekend are taken from the 27th Sunday in Ordinary time and they provide a fitting way of embracing both the spirituality of St. Therese and St. Francis and closing the Season of Creation. The First Reading from the prophet Isaiah is a love song for his friend and vineyard, a metaphor for God's love for Israel. But any romance is soon dashed as the prophet's 'love-song' swiftly turns sour: '*He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.*' (Isaiah 5:7). The imagery of the vineyard continues in the Gospel (Matt 21:33-43). Jesus warns the religious leadership of the urgent need to collaborate with God's plan, instead of trying to control and hoard for themselves the vineyard (Israel) and its produce (the life of the people). A similar urgency is found in *Laudato Si'* when Pope Francis reminds us Mother Earth now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by plundering and seeing ourselves as her lords and masters. This was evident in the recent blowing up of the 46,000-year-old Juukan Gorge caves in the Pilbara for mining. Here again, God's vineyard is subject to violence and greed as traditional owners of the land were ignored and disrespected. Misuse of the Earth's resources that benefit the few, and the spilled blood of our sisters and brothers who die because of violence and war, involve us all.



What type of tenant am I? Do I live to serve and take care of others, or do I use them for my own profit and interest? Am I conscious of my accountability for all I have received? Let us walk together with Saints Therese and Francis in being people of action, of doing small deeds with great love, of caring for our common home and for each other as we would a vineyard or garden. Our future depends on it. This weekend we celebrate this

interconnectedness in the various cultures and voices that make up our parish community. Happy feast day to one and all!

POLISH NEWS

Św. Teresa od Dzieciątka Jezus, mała - wielka święta

Święta Teresa urodziła się 2 stycznia 1873 r w Alencon jako ostatnia z dziewięciorga dzieci Zelii Guerin i Ludwika Martin. Jej ojciec był zegarmistrzem, matka zaś koronkarką. Rodzice byli ludźmi pobożnymi i doświadczonymi przez cierpienie. Teresa krótko cieszyła się bliskością mamy. Zelia zachorowała na raka i zmarła 28 sierpnia 1877 r. W listopadzie cała rodzina przeprowadziła się do Lisieux do domu wuja Izzydora.

Gdy Tereska skończyła 8 lat, rozpoczęła naukę w szkole klasztornej sióstr benedytek. 13 maja 1883 r. została uzdrowiona z ciężkiej choroby za pośrednictwem Matki Boskiej Zwycięskiej. W wieku 14 lat, w noc Bożego Narodzenia 1886 r. otrzymała łaskę wzmocnienia w znoszeniu cierpień. Latem odkryła w sobie powołanie misyjne. Poruszona do głębi obrazem ukrzyżowanego Jezusa, odczuła pragnienie ratowania grzesznych dusz. Zanosila żarliwe

modlitwy w intencji nawrócenia mordercy, niejakiego Pranziniego. Skazaniec w ostatniej chwili przed ścięciem pocałował krucyfiks. 29 maja 1887 r. Teresa poprosiła tatę o pozwolenie na wstąpienie do Karmelu. Swoją prośbę przedstawiła także papieżowi Leonowi XIII w czasie pielgrzymki odbytej w listopadzie. Mimo trudności Teresie udało się w końcu zrealizować pragnienie 9 kwietnia 1888 r. wstąpiła do Karmelu w Lisieux. Rok później – 10 stycznia rozpoczęła nowicjat. W ceremonii obłóczyn uczestniczył jej tata, który był już poważnie chory na uwiąd starczy. 8 września 1890 r. złożyła swoje śluby zakonne. Rok później odkryła „małą drogę dziecięctwa duchowego”. Pragnęła by jej życie stało się aktem doskonałej miłości, a cierpienie możliwością jej pogłębienia i wykazania. W lutym 1893 r. została mistrzynią nowicjatu. Rok później 29 lipca umarł jej tata. 30 września 1897 r. umarła w ekstazie miłości. W 1997 r. ogłoszono ją Doktorem Kościoła.

Teresa wstępując do klasztoru miała zaledwie 15 lat. Jej życie zakonne zakończyło się po dziewięciu latach brutalnie przerwane przez gruźlicę, gdy miała tylko 24 lata. Jednak ten krótki czas wystarczył Teresie, by pozostawić nam piękny przykład miłości Boga, pragnienia ofiary z siebie i świętości, która rodzi się z wielkiego zaufania Bogu, że to On prowadzi i daje łaskę. Św. Teresa jest patronką nowicjuszek.

1.11.2020 Różaniec na cmentarzu Cornelian o godz. 3 po południu.

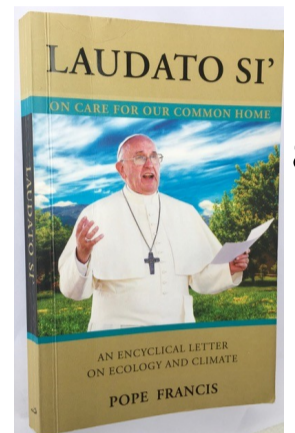

Safe Communities is a Framework and is an initiative of the Archdiocese of Hobart to protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and neglect. The Framework requires the involvement of everyone in the Catholic Church within the Archdiocese. This Framework has been developed to ensure compliance with the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

As part of this Framework volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy are required to have a current police check and Working with Vulnerable Persons check.

To ensure that the Parish is compliant for the Audit in November 2020, the list of volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy is required to hold the required checks. Failure to obtain these required checks will result in the volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy, not being able to undertake their ministry.
