Dear Parish Family,

As we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we are reminded of the dignity and sacredness of our own bodies and of all creation. In Jesus, the Word made Flesh, we see how seriously God takes humanity. In the Incarnation, not only does divinity enter humanity but humanity discovers and recognises its own divinity.

Our Catholic tradition holds that God did not allow Mary's body to "return to dust" but Assumed her body and soul into the life of heaven. This was due to the fact that Mary had borne Jesus into the world... the Word had taken flesh in and through her. The same can be said of us. Through the Holy Spirit, poured out upon us in Baptism and sealed in the Sacrament of Confirmation, Christ continues to "take flesh" in our world. When we love in His name, when we give in His name, when we serve in His name, we make Christ present and recognise Christ present, especially in the poor and vulnerable. The same honour due to Mary is therefore afforded to us, as parts of His body.

The reverence due to every human person is also given to all of creation. In the power and timelessness, the beauty and balance of creation we see the fingerprints of God. Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si', which was unpacked for us at a workshop last Saturday, highlights the reverence due to creation and the blight of pollution and exploitation which threaten the viability of life on earth. The Pope echoes the call of many others to take small, personal actions to care for the planet, and to deepen our sense of wonder and awe at the beauty that surrounds us. September is designated as the Season of Creation, commencing with the World Day of Prayer for Creation on 1st September and closing on the Feast of St Francis of Assisi on 4th October. There will be some further information circulated at that time.

For now, let us pray that the Feast of the Assumption of the Mary will turn our hearts and minds towards reverence for the Blessed Virgin, for the sacredness of all human life, and to a profound respect for all of God's creation.
