Dear Parish Family,

The weather forecast looks very bright for our parish picnic on Sunday. I do hope you can join us for a celebration of community and belonging. This coming Wednesday, 17th February is Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of Lent. We are called to deeper conversion, turning away from sin towards the life giving way of the Lord. Thursday 11th February was World Day of Prayer for the Sick. We are unable to celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick in a communal setting due to the Coronavirus restrictions, but we include a prayer for the sick in this newsletter and in our Mass, as we acknowledge the isolation that sickness causes and as we pray God's blessings on those who care for the sick and visit the housebound. In today's Gospel Jesus stretched out his hand and touched the leper, not only bringing healing to his disease, but bridging the void that existed between the healthy and the sick. May we do the same, reaching out to the "other" in recognition of their human dignity, seeing beyond the superficial differences that may exist.
