Dear Parish Family,

In March we were plunged into uncertainty and retreated to our homes to wait out the pandemic. We watched the mounting death toll in other parts of the world. Fear and panic buying eased as information gave us some sense of control. Long days of isolation saw neighbours reach out and families rediscover the fun of simple things. New experiences such as homeschooling and on-line Mass became normal for a time. Hand sanitiser is now everywhere as CovidSafe Plans dictate community life and the economic impact continues to be felt throughout the community.

Through it all, we have been sustained by the love of family, friends and neighbours, courageously led by our Premier Peter Gutwein and accompanied by our God who promised to be with us always. There is no doubt this has been a challenging experience which has impacted us all. While there remains no certainty regarding the next stages of the journey, I have a new appreciation for the resilience of those who lived through the World Wars which raged for five and six years. Unfortunately, individuals sitting in their favorite seat will soon mean others have to miss out on Mass, so I continue to ask for your patience and understanding. Our two evening Masses have plenty of capacity at this stage.
