Dear Parish Family,

We breathe a sigh of relief as further easing of Government restrictions means we can accommodate more people in our churches. We are now permitted 75% of the fixed seating capacity in our churches. We are still required to maintain an attendance register for track and tracing purposes, and this will continue to prove a logistical challenge over Easter where extra crowds will slow our procedures somewhat. Despite the extra capacity inside the churches, the overflow to the Parish Hall will still be set up for the Easter ceremonies with live stream video and a minister bringing communion to the hall as required. Thanks for your understanding if you find yourself in the hall for any of the Easter services.

By the first of May we will be required to register attendance at all services in the Parish using the "Check-in Tas" app. This will no doubt provide some further challenges, but I am confident in your on-going patience and understanding! This app will be available this weekend and at Easter services, so the invitation is there to trial it if you are familiar with it. For those of you who do not have mobile phones, we will maintain a few volunteers who can register you each time you come to church. Once more I extend my thanks to the team of COVID volunteers who have given so generously of their time over the past twelve months. Their efforts in keeping the churches sanitised will continue for some time to come.

As we begin the journey through Holy Week, we accompany Jesus through his suffering and death, but in reality it is Jesus who accompanies us as we face those very familiar human experiences. Let us each make a special effort to ensure that the events we recall this week continue to be a life-giving source of strength and hope for the tougher times in our lives.
