Dear Parish family,

We are gradually coming to an end of this liturgical year. Scripture readings during this time usually call on us to reflect on 'the last things'. The last things are the various stages through which we shall experience the reconciling and renewing love of God. They are death, judgment, heaven, hell, purgatory, Second Coming of Christ, resurrection and the consummation of all things in the perfection of the Kingdom of God (R. McBrien, *Catholicism* Vol II).

The Church believes that at the moment of death, the soul goes to Heaven, or to Hell, or to Purgatory, following its relations with God. The communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed is called Heaven. The state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called Hell. The state meant for the final purification of the elect so that they can achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven is called Purgatory (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1022-1031).

Let's consider heaven for this week. Do we attain heaven by the works of our hands? The answer is **NO**. We are saved by **grace**; unmerited favour/unmerited gift of God (Ephesians 2:8-9). Since we are saved by grace, does it mean that we should not strive for goodness, truth and beauty? If truly we are living a life of grace, goodness, truth and beauty will become our second nature; "For we are God's art, created in Christ Jesus for good works" (Ephesians 2:10).

My dear friends, although God has saved us through his Son, Jesus Christ, we are constantly called to participate actively in God's saving action. This call is shown in all our readings today – 'For you who fear (love) my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays,' *Malachi 3:20*, 'Be not idle in doing good,' *2 Thessalonians 3:7-12*, and in the Gospel, Jesus says – 'Your endurance (in doing good and being faithful to God and his teachings) will win you your lives,' *Luke 21:19*.

May the grace of God make its home in us. Amen.
