Dear Parish family,

Good morning. I hope that you are doing well, knowing that Jesus Christ is the King of our lives. Today, the Church celebrates the solemnity of Christ the King. He alone is the true King of the universe. He is an 'unusual' King. Instead of sitting on a throne, he leaned on a cross, instead of wearing a crown of diadem, he wore many thorns, instead of commanding his soldiers to die for the people, he died to save us all.

In the Old Testament, kings were mainly seen as military leaders; they commanded their armies to fight against the enemies (Josh 12; 1Sam 11:1; 2Sam 8:1-6). In today's first reading – 2Sam 5:-13, David is crowned king over the twelve tribes of Israel. The people are happy to have him as their king because he is seen as one who is capable of leading them to victory over their enemies.

In the New Testament, we see an 'unusual' king. His name is Jesus Christ. His power is love not war. His might is mercy not revenge. He is anointed not by human beings but God. He is rejected, abused and nailed to the Cross by his citizens Lk 23:35-43. Yet, God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at his name every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, Phil 2:9-10. Let's acknowledge him as our King, that he may acknowledge us as heirs of his kingdom. Let's also think about how we can use our power to love, instead of using it to hate.
